Michigan Public Service Commission Reduces UPPCO's Proposed Rate Increase

LANSING – The Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC) today ruled that the Upper Peninsula Power Company (UPPCO) will be allowed to increase its electric rates by \$4,647,975 annually, effective September 23. This rate increase is lower than the \$6,259,025 rate increase that the company self-implemented in March of this year. As a result, residential customers using 500 kWh of electricity per month will see their monthly bills decrease by \$0.65.

As a result of the MPSC's ruling, UPPCO's Interim Chief Executive Officer and Chief Operating Officer Keith Moyle issued the following statement:

“UPPCO will continue to make the investments required to provide safe and reliable service for our customers. These investments include improvements to our distribution system and the clearing of tree limbs and brush to increase reliability.”
